



School roll information capture (2022)

Purpose

This document sets out roll information for schools in the Wellington region. This information is correct as of 11th October 2022.

We have included state-integrated schools in this information. State-integrated schools have a special character (usually Anglican/Catholic etc.) and the buildings are owned by a private entity and are capped by a “maximum roll”. The Ministry of Education does provide some maintenance funding for buildings, as well as setting or altering the maximum roll. We have used the maximum roll for state-integrated schools, rather than the onsite capacity.

It should be noted that although state-integrated schools are part of the education network, these schools have a special character which may not appeal to all families. This means that population growth will not necessarily result in an increase in enrolments or available maximum roll at these schools being utilised.

We have used the July 2022 rolls for all schools. Primary and Intermediate schools have been grouped together as primary schools in this report.

There have been some significant changes compared to the last report, this is due to roll growth teaching spaces being added to some schools alongside roll decline seen across the Wellington Region. The below combined regions saw a decline of 1,746 primary and intermediate students and a decline of 167 across secondary students.

Roll Information

Wellington City

Wellington Central and South

- There are 16 state primary school in the Wellington Central catchment. Of these 16, four are state-integrated schools. There is space for approximately 353 students at the four primary state-integrated schools. Due to roll decline at some schools and some roll growth there is now 479 spare student spaces in the state primary network. We continue to expect growth in the long term in this area and are monitoring the schools and population closely.
- There are four secondary schools (St Mary’s College; Wellington Girls’ College; Wellington High School and Wellington College) servicing the Wellington Central catchment as well as the Wellington West catchment. St Mary’s College is a state-integrated school. The other three operate enrolment scheme’s and are at or over capacity. We note that all three college enrol students from outside their respective zones which although are counted for capacity purposes are not included when considering new property.
- Wellington Girls College was funded a redevelopment and 16 additional teaching spaces. Wellington High School has been allocated roll growth teaching spaces to be delivered along side

Wellington West

- There are seven state and two state-integrated primary schools in this catchment around the Karori/Wadestown and surrounding areas. There is space for 488 students in state and 405 in the state-integrated schools.
- There is no secondary school in Wellington West. Students here are in-zone for Wellington Girls’ College, Wellington College and Wellington High School.

Wellington East

- There are 11 state and four state-integrated primary schools in this areas. There is space for 929 students in the state network and approximately 424 spare student spaces in the state-integrated schools.
- There are four secondary schools servicing this catchment (St Patrick's College, St Catherine's College, Wellington East Girls' College and Rongotai College). All four of these schools are single sex schools, Wellington High School has this area with their enrolment scheme also . There is space for 149 students in the state schools (Wellington East Girls' College and Rongotai College). There is space for 217 students in the state-integrated schools (St Patrick's College and St Catherine's College).

Northern Wellington

- This area is a key area of growth we do anticipate continued significant housing growth in this area.
- There are 20 state and three state-integrated primary schools in the catchment. There is capacity for 1036 students in the state primary schools and 160 in the state-integrated primary schools. There has been and continues to be significant investment in the schools in this area. Also, some schools (mainly primary) have seen roll decline also we would anticipate that this decline would not be a long term trend.
- There are three state secondary schools (Newlands College, Onslow College and Tawa College) servicing this area. These schools are all at or above capacity.
- Amesbury School has been allocated funding to build stage 2 of the school, this will provide an extra 200 student spaces at the school. Onslow College was allocated roll growth for 20 teaching spaces. Newlands College has been allocated 10 teaching spaces. Raroa Normal and Newlands Intermediates have also been allocated roll growth.

Porirua City

Porirua West

- There are five state primary and two state-integrated primary schools in this catchment. There is space for 317 students in the state schools and 167 students in the state-integrated schools. Only one of these schools currently operate an enrolment scheme (Titahi Bay School).
- There are two secondary school in Porirua West (Mana College and Bishop Viard College). Bishop Viard College currently has space for approximately 407 students. Mana College currently has space for 90 students. Mana College is undergoing a redevelopment once completed the college will have a capacity of 600 student spaces.

Porirua East

- The regeneration of Kāinga Ora housing across Porirua East continues. There is a short term impact occurring at the schools due to the movement of families.
- There are 10 state and one state-integrated school in this catchment. There is currently space 813 students in the state primary network, and around 88 spaces in the state-integrated school.
- There is one secondary school in this catchment, Porirua College. This school currently has space for 79 students.

Porirua North

- We anticipate significant growth in the long term in the area between Camborne and Pukerua Bay. This area is currently be assessed by Kāinga Ora as a potential Specified Development Project, this could mean a more streamlined process for this development. This area is a key area for growth.
- There are nine state primary schools and one state-integrated primary school in this catchment. There is space for 473 students in the state primary network and space for 37 students in the state-integrated school.
- There is one secondary school in the catchment, Aotea College. This school is at capacity. Roll growth teaching spaces have been allocated to Aotea College.
- Papakowhai School was provided four temporary teaching spaces, Discovery School was provided three teaching spaces. Adventure School provided two teaching spaces. All these roll growth classrooms are now on site and in use.

Kāpiti Coast District

Northern Kāpiti

- We anticipate significant long term growth in this region, it is a key region of growth for us.
- There are five state primary schools and one state-integrated school in this catchment. There is space for 218 students in the state primary network and 130 students in the state-integrated school.
- There is one secondary school in this catchment, Otaki College. This School has space for 332 students.
- There is no secondary state-integrated provision in this area.
- Waikanae and Kapakapanui Schools have been allocated funding for teaching spaces.

Kāpiti South

- There are seven primary schools and two state-integrated schools in this catchment. There is space for 400 students in the state primary schools and 208 students in the state integrated primary schools.
- There are two secondary schools in this catchment. Both these schools are at or over capacity. Although one College takes around 420 students from outside their enrolment scheme. Approximately half of these do still come from the area.
- There is no secondary state-integrated provision in this area.
- Paraparaumu College was allocated funding for 10 teaching spaces.

Horowhenua District

- This area is a key area of growth, we anticipate some long term significant growth in this region.
- There are 14 state primary schools and two state-integrated primary schools in this catchment. There is space for 706 students in the state primary schools and 202 students in the state-integrated schools.
- There are three state secondary schools in this catchment. There is space for 252 students across these three secondary schools.
- There is no secondary state-integrated provision in this area.

Lower Hutt City

Wainuiomata

- There are six state primary schools and one state-integrated primary school in the catchment. There is space for 580 students in the state primary school network and space for 103 students in the state-integrated primary network.
- There is one secondary school in Wainuiomata which currently has space for 427 student spaces. The government announced a redevelopment for the school, the first stages on this redevelopment have recently started.
- This area is a focus for Hutt City Council who have a number of housing developments planned and underway here.

Lower Hutt South

- There are 12 state primary schools and five state-integrated primary schools in this catchment. There is space for 937 students in the state primary network and space for 127 students in the state-integrated primary network.
- There is one state secondary school (Hutt Valley High School) and three state-integrated secondary schools. Hutt Valley High School is at capacity, although it has around 130 students from outside their enrolment scheme. There is space for 54 students in the state-integrated secondary school network.
- There is one state-integrated composite school, Raphael House Rudolf Steiner Area School. This school has space for 70 students.

Lower Hutt North

- There are 14 state primary schools and two state-integrated primary schools in this catchment. The state schools have space for around 976 students, and the state-integrated schools have space for around 277 students.
- There are two state secondary schools in this catchment, (Taita College and Naenae College). They have space for around 534 students.
- There is one state-integrated composite school, Wa Ora Montessori School. It has space for around 66 students.

Upper Hutt City

- There are 13 state primary schools and two state-integrated primary schools in this catchment. There is space for around 647 students in the state primary network and space for around 47 students in the state-integrated primary network.
- There are two state secondary schools and two state-integrated secondary schools in this catchment. There is space for 279 students in the state secondary schools. The state integrated secondary schools are at capacity. Both the state-integrated secondary schools are male only schools.
- Trentham School received two teaching spaces. Heretaunga College received eight short term roll growth alongside an enrolment scheme reduction.

South Wairarapa and Carterton Districts

- There are 10 state primary schools and two state-integrated primary schools in this catchment. There is space for 274 students in the state primary schools and 60 students in the state-integrated primary schools.
- There is one state secondary school in this catchment, Kuranui College. This school is at capacity. Roll growth teaching spaces have been allocated to Kuranui College.
- There is one state-integrated composite school, Ponatahi Christian School. This school has space for 46 students.

Masterton District

- There are 11 state primary schools and two state-integrated primary schools in this catchment. There is space for 279 students in the state primary schools and 103 students in the state-integrated primary schools.
- There are two state secondary schools and four state-integrated secondary schools in this catchment. There is space for 387 students in the state secondary schools and 269 students in the state-integrated secondary schools.
